


Music

Encourage students to perform, analyze, and appreciate Music with resources that explore music from various time periods and cultures. Young learners can play Bubble Beats, an interactive lesson that challenges students to differentiate between beats. Middle and high school students can research different styles of music, from hip-hop to the blues to latin rock, and report on them to their classmates. Teachers can combine music and other disciplines with several lesson plans that include visuals and support materials, such as "Belarusian Waltz: Art as a Form of Protest," "Macbeth | The Metropolitan Opera," or "The Dancing Scientist | Take the Stage." Careers in music, music in world cultures, and music institutions are among the additional topics explored in Music.
